February 23, 2016

Chairman Thomas Caruso called the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners to order at 7:32pm. The notice was read and Chief Wayne Prochnow led the flag salute. Motion was made by Mr. Buscaglia to approve the minutes from the December 22, 2015 executive session.

Assistant Chief Ken Lucas discussed:
